

Primary 6 Intended Learning Plan

What will we be learning this term?

Language - Reading, Writing, Listening and Talking

In Literacy this term we will continue to focus on writing paragraphs. We will use this learning to support writing a persuasive piece of work.

P6 will also be learning our Scots Poem for Scots week.

P6 will continue to read 1-2 times a week with their reading group and receive feedback from an adult, as well as completing vocabulary and comprehension extension work on the text.

We will also be starting reading buddies with both Primary 1 classes.

Please encourage your child to read at home as often as possible to improve vocabulary knowledge, pace and comprehension skills.



Mathematics

P6 will continue to investigate the relationship between decimals, percentages and fractions this term and relating them to real life examples.

Fractions and decimals will also help to support the class when we learning about Time and Measurement.

Please encourage your child to participate in calculating the cost/amounts of everyday things such as a groceries list or online ordering and telling the time on an analogue clock.



Social Studies

Continuing on from learning about Scottish landscapes and mapping, P6 will begin to research key historical events that have happened in Scotland. This topic will be pupils led and so the subject will be decided by the class. Some possibilities could include events such as the Highland Clearances or the Jacobites.



STEM

Primary 6 will be learning about the human anatomy, including the names of body parts and the different systems that make our body work, including the 5 senses, skeletal, blood, digestive and nervous systems, as well as investigating how to keep our bodies fit and healthy.



Expressive Arts

It's our favourite time of the year...the Scottish Opera is coming to Dalry!

Primary 6 will be working towards a performance of 'Vikings! The Quest for the Dragon's Treasure' in partnership with Scottish Opera this term. The pupils will also be learning about Chinese Opera and working in groups to create their own musical opera.



Health & Well-Being

Following on from learning about the human anatomy, P6 will also learn about 'my body, love & relationships' later in the term. This will be taught using the RSHP website endorsed by the Scottish Government.

These lessons will include whole class and small group discussions about different types of relationships, what love means and understanding changes that happen to our bodies as we get older.



Ethos and Wider Life of the School

P6 will be pairing up with both Primary 1 classes to support them with reading once per week. This is a great
opportunity to build positive relationships with the younger pupils, work on communication and language skills
and their reading fluency.

 P6 will continue to support younger pupils in the playground on a Tuesday through playing games and using the school values to support pupils to make good choices in the playground.

Planned opportunities for wider achievement

- Our Equalities Reps, Olivia and Oreofe, will be delivering a lesson about Race to our Primary 6 class.
- Our sustainability reps, Jamie and Ayaan, have been working hard with Miss Low to develop understanding and ideas about the 17 new sustainability goals.
- Faizah and Alfie, our Pupil Council reps, have been working with their group to improve aspects of our school, linked to sustainability, including the playground and recycling.
